Scriptures ISR

This is the genealogy of Ya'aqob. Yosëph, being seventeen years old, was feeding the flock with his brothers. And the young man was with the sons of Bilhah and the sons of Zilpah, his father's wives. And Yosëph brought an evil report of them to his father.

Genesis 37:3-4

(3) And Yisra'el loved Yoseph more than all his children, because he was the son of his old age.

And he made him a long robe.

(4) But when his brothers saw that their father loved him more than all his brothers, they hated him and were not able to speak peaceably to him.

Genesis 22:1-2

(1) And it came to be after these events that Elohim tried Abraham, and said to him, "Abraham!" And he said, "Here I am."

(2) And He said, "Take your son, now, your only son Yitshaq, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriyah, and offer him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains which I command you."

Genesis 37:23

(23) So it came to be, when Yoseph had come to his brothers, that they stripped Yoseph of his robe, the long robe which was on him.

Matthew 27:28

(28) And having stripped Him, they put a scarlet robe on Him.

Genesis 37:26-27

(26) And Yehudah said to his brothers, "What would we gain if we kill our brother and conceal his blood?"

(31) So they took Yoseph's robe, killed a male goat, and dipped the robe in the blood,
